Historical Snippets

The Carroll Record, was first published in Taneytown on July 7, 1894. Preston B. Englar served as the editor and business manager of the newspaper from 1894 until his death in 1945. He was recognized by his peers as a skillful and efficient Editor. Mr. Englar also developed and patented a metal rural delivery mail box approved by the U. S. Postal Department in 1901. It was noted for it's affordable price and the fact it combined postal requirements of security, size, shape and accessibility. He was succeeded by his assistant, Mr. Charles L. Stonesifer, who continued as The Carroll Record Editor until 1967.
