## *The 2017 Spring Opening Day for The Taneytown History Museum*



## What's going on at the Museum?

The Taneytown School Bell, on the lawn of the museum, will be dedicated on opening day in honor of the museum cofounders, Mr. George B. Crouse and Mr. George W. Naylor. The bell was housed in the cupola of the school located on York Street until the school was torn down in 1925.

Along with the new quilt room display we will also unveil an Eli Bentley clock donated to the museum by the Kenneth Crouse family in memory of Kenneth's parents: the late Mr. George W. and Mrs. H. Pauline Crouse. Kenny's father originally bought the clock and had it on display at Antrim during

guests, we need maintenance assistance both inside and out and landscape helpers. Even if you have only an hour or two available, your help is needed and much appreciated.



"Story Quilts from around Taneytown" is the title of the new featured exhibit at the Museum. Many quilts have a story to tell – sometimes a story about the quilter, sometimes a story about where it has travelled, sometimes a family story about the user. Some quilts are very old, others brand new, but each is very unique, with their own story.

### 2017 THMA Ornament 10th Edition

Cambridge Rubber Company is the site chosen as the ornament for 2017. The aerial view shows most of the early buildings of the large company. Price of the ornament remains at \$12 each. In production now, information on the back reads:

Beginning operation in 1936, the Blue Ridge Rubber Co. produced casual and waterproof footwear. Peak employment was 1000, 70% women. Completely destroyed by fire in 1942 and rebuilt in 1943, it became Cambridge Rubber Co. in 1948 and continued production until closing in 1986.
