

Museum is one of 4 county museums participating. The exhibit highlights Taneytown industries of the mid-twentieth century - Blue Ridge/Cambridge Rubber Co., sewing factories Taneytown Manufacturing Co./Borenstein & Son, Inc. and Taney Sewing Co. and the two canneries, A. W. Feeser & Co. and E. J. Nusbaum. Other county museums participating are the Sykesville Gatehouse Museum, the Union Mills Homestead and the Carroll County Farm Museum. Watch for more information about the "Passport" incentive program, encouraging you to visit all four sites.

Historical Snippets

Located at the crossroads of the much-travelled, north/south bound, Monocacy Road and an east/west road coming from Uniontown, colonial Taneytown was a choice site for an inn or tavern. At one time taverns occupied all four corners of the Square. On the northeast corner, a license was purchased, and a tavern was opened by **Jacob Good** in 1767. Across the street, on Lot #3, **Ulrich Hoover** had a license in 1763. The southwest corner, Lot #4, was the location of **Conrad Boner's** business as an innkeeper and tailor. By 1768, **Phillip Fishburn** had bought a license to operate an inn on Lot #2.

T.H.M.A. and the Taneytown History Museum will be participating in "*Celebrating America*" on May 20th at Emerald Hill, 1838 Emerald Hill Lane, in Westminster. This year's theme is "American Milestones: 1900-1920 Labor and Leisure." Events include opening ceremonies, a fashion show of period clothes, Gen. Pershing living history presentation, entertainment by middle school choral groups and more. We will have a booth and be offering our brooms and annual ornaments for sale as well as some hands-on activities for children. "*The Civil War in Carroll County*" is the 2017 theme of the annual Corbit's Charge Commemorative Weekend sponsored by the Pipe Creek Civil War Roundtable. This year's main event will be held June 24th at Emerald Hill, 1838 Emerald Hill Lane in Westminster. In order to take full advantage of this opportunity to tell Taneytown's Civil War story, Author Joe Vigliotti is working with T.H.M.A. and the History Museum to publish a brochure highlighting the role Taneytown played during the conflict. A full weekend of activities, including an encampment and reenactment, is planned. Again, please contact Pam (410-984-2427) if you can volunteer to help.
