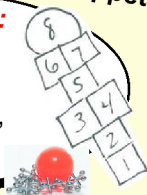

You heard about **the Cook Stove in the kitchen**, let me tell you about 'ME'... the Chunk Stove.

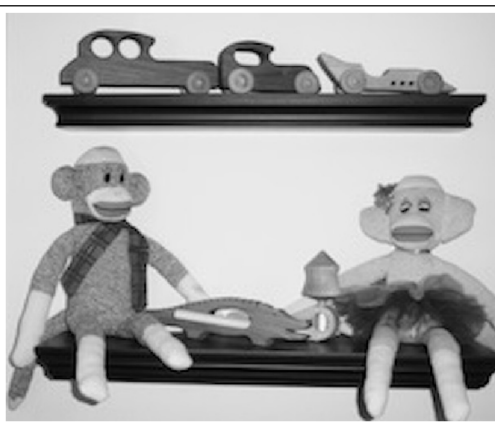
