Excerpt from "A Dam Good Town"
by Rev. Dr. David W. Shaum

Interestingly, Taneytown is "a town built on a hill." On all four sides of the compass, you ascend to the heart of the town - the square.

On another elevation in an alley - now known as Riffle's Alley - was a water tower which we called "the Stand Pipe." Water was pumped from a station on Piney Creek into this standing receptacle.

Slightly below this vertical structure was "the lard can" - a round metal structure that served as a jail. There was a door and a lock, and an opening or aperture for air and sunlight. I do not know anyone who was incarcerated there at any time. It was just a temporary holding cell, until the miscreant was transported to the jail at Westminster, the County Seat of Carroll County. Both structures have served their purpose and have since been razed.

A happier place nearby was the summer playground, conducted by Mrs. Francis T. Elliott for the children of the community. Five days-a-week, the tots were invited to come there for the morning hours - playing games, making crafts, and doing whatever was offered that particular morning. This kept the youngsters busy and made their summer vacation a learning experience. Mrs. Elliott was a pioneer in setting up the program for children; it ran for several years.
