We are anxious to show off our new tent at events... we will not be missed!!





Looking Back

From The History Museum 2016 Exhibit

Lantern, c. 1890...

Many fraternal, Masonic, and social organizations functioned in Taneytown in the late 1800's and early 1900's.

This lantern originally hung outside of the building that first housed the hardware store of Milton H. Reindollar (presently the Country Kitchen). The upstairs room was used as a meeting hall for those "lodges" and "societies."

Glass plates bearing the initials and emblem of each group were placed in the lantern depending upon which group was meeting that evening, at nightfall, the lantern was lit, illuminating the glass plates.



A special box was made to house the various plates when they were not in use. Among the plates, one can find the following groups: M.W.A. – Modern Woodsmen of America; K.P. – Knights of Pythias; I.O.O.F. – Independent Order of Odd fellows; P.O.S.A. – Patriotic Order Sons of America; I.O.H. – Independent Order of Heptasophs; A.F.&A.M. – Ancient Free and Accepted Masons
