



The 705' Little Pipe Creek Bridge. In 1871, the Frederick & Pennsylvania Line Railroad began construction of a bridge to cross Little Pipe Creek near Keymar, MD. In 1896, the Pennsylvania Railroad acquired ownership of the Frederick & Pennsylvania Line RR and began rebuilding this bridge. By 1903, the bridge was replaced with steel plate girder span which stands today.

and west sides of the new walkway, a new county requirement. I expect full approval by the end of January.

Last year we decided to help out Elaine Hoover who spends many hours getting our information to any place that will publish her articles and information. We contracted a marketing consultant to add to Elaine's great work.

We have implemented some of the ideas in 2023 and have more to come in 2024. We have started using a lot more pictures and short posts on social media: trying to use real time posts during events, even short videos and using little "did you know" posts to keep the museum out there all the time. If anyone uses social media and would like to help with posts, get in touch with me.

We will be having a training session on using social media soon and I will reach out to all with an invitation. Don't be bashful, I'm the first to need training on social media.

The other big thing you will notice will be a new sign. Marketing involves branding, we want potential visitors to immediately and positively connect specific images and colors with the museum, to that end, we're using the bell as our main icon so that every time they drive or walk past our building they know exactly who we are and what we do! It might also be worth mentioning we're fixing the name, Historical Museum, on the sign, which we think has been a significant source of confusion among residents who tend to think we're more of a research center than a museum. Believe it or not we still have people who do not know we exist or where we are located. The existing clock logo will remain as the artwork for the Taneytown Heritage and Museum Association.
